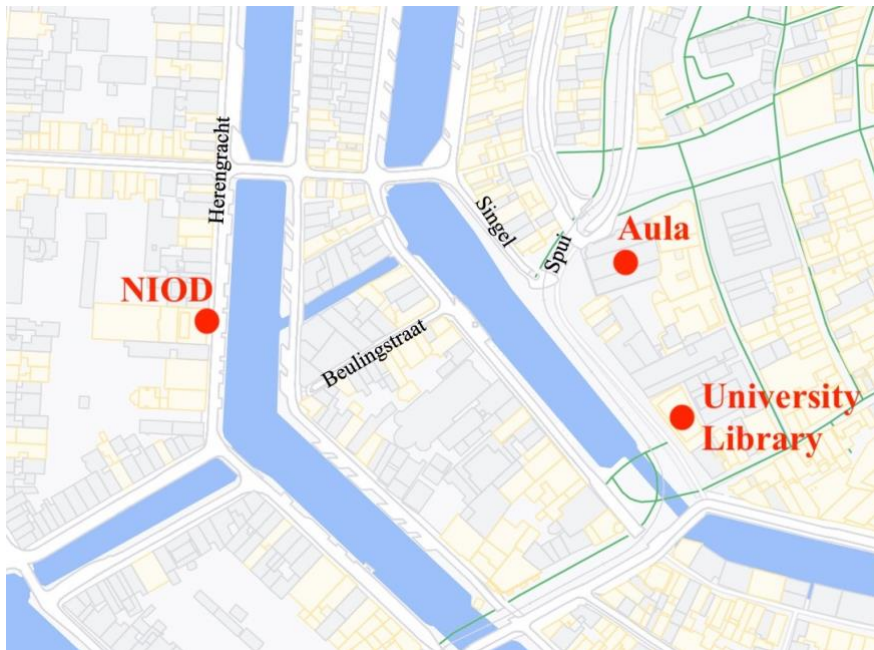

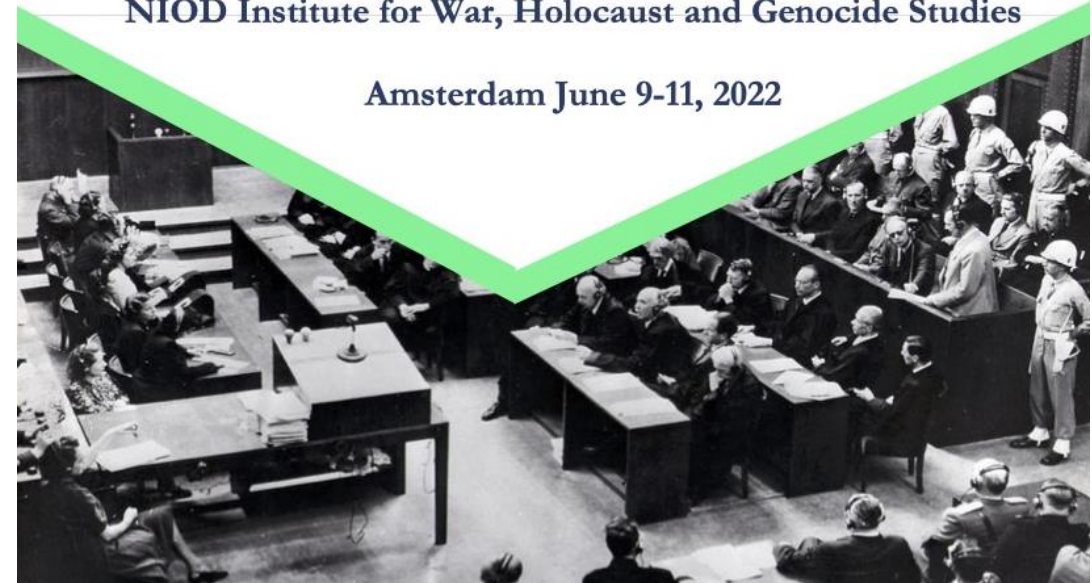

He was founding Director of the Cambodian Genocide Program (1994-99) and of the Genocide Studies Program ([gsp.yale.edu](http://gsp.yale.edu)) from 1998-2015, and was chair of Yale’s Council on Southeast Asia Studies from 2010-15. His books include *How Pol Pot Came to Power* (1985); *The Pol Pot Regime* (1996); *Genocide and Resistance in Southeast Asia* (2007); *Blood and Soil: A World History of Genocide and Extermination from Sparta to Darfur* (2007); and *Việt Nam: A History from Earliest Times to the Present* (2017).
